PREPARATION FOR SIEF

After the pre-registration process of REACH (the Regulation for Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals), manufacturers and importers of substances, preparations and intentionally released substances from articles are able to benefit from the formation of a Substance Information Exchange Forum, or SIEF, to share relevant and available data among all Potential Registrants of the same phase-in substance.

COMPLEX INVENTORY

The objectives of the Complex Inventory are to:

- Collect data available on your substance;
- Identify data gaps (to be ready for the data sharing); and to
- Be ready for entry into the SIEF (data and cost sharing).

COLLECT CONSTRUCTIVE INFORMATION

SGS will build your Complex Inventory to ensure that the most relevant and available data is collected:

- Customer Supply Chain Analysis – collect information on uses and exposure from your downstream users.

- Data Gap Analysis – identify information gaps and if the registrant has to take action, depending on the missing information (data sharing, generation of new study, testing proposal).
- Persistent, Bioaccumulative & Toxic / very Persistent, very Bioaccumulative Chemicals (PBT/vPvB) Assessment – assess the properties of the substance and compare them with the criteria of Annex XIII of REACH.
- Classification and Labelling – check and evaluate the classification and labelling in preparation for the discussion in the SIEF in accordance with the criteria of Directive 67/548/EEC and the new Globally Harmonised System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals (GHS).
- Substance Identification – prepare for the pre-SIEF discussion on the sameness of the substances and for the preparation of your registration dossier.

SGS also offers Third Party Representative service for participation on your behalf in the SIEF as well as the preparation and submission of the technical dossier and the Chemical Safety Report as required for Registration.
